1. Simile

Ex: The speaker uses the word 'like' to compare faces with a row of eggs.

2. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker is comparing the punches to avalanches without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

3. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares making music to spinning webs without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

4. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares the landscape to a fan by using the word 'like.'

5. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares sunlight to a hammer without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

6. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares fear to steel armor by using the word 'like.'

7. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares the night to a sword using the word 'as.'

8. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares her voice to bubbling water by using the word 'like.'

9. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares children to flowers without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

10. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares her words to a pointed wall without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

11. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares the town to a pearl using the word 'like.'

12. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares the strong men to plungers using the word 'as.'

13. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares the northern winds to Norwegian wines without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

14. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares the subject's voice to bells using the word 'like.'

15. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares the subject's shadow to sunlight without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

16. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares the subject's smile to sugar without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

17. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares flowers to stars using the word 'like.'

18. Simile

Ex: The speaker compares an opal to a milky, rainbow moon using the word 'like.'

19. Metaphor

Ex: The speaker compares her heart to an empty cup without using the word 'like' or 'as.'

Ex: The speaker compares her kisses to buds of fire without using the word 'like' or 'as.'
